LIBERTY CLASSICAL ACADEMY, founded in 2003, was established to give families a private school option in the Twin Cities that is as committed to **academic excellence** as it is to **building lives that inspire**. A Preschool through 12th grade classical Christian school, learning at Liberty Classical is structured by the Trivium, which reflects students' cognitive stages of development.

MISSION

Liberty Classical Academy's mission is to equip students of all backgrounds to grow in wisdom, excellence, and purpose by offering an education based on the highest academic standards grounded in a strong classical tradition from a distinctively Christian world view.

ACADEMIC SUMMARY

Liberty teaches all subjects as part of a systematic, coordinated study of humanity from ancient to modern times. In four-year cycles, students advance through four historical stages of human progress, studying the history, science, literature, and arts of each time period.

Structured by the Trivium, learning at Liberty Classical Academy reflects the cognitive stages of development for students. Grammar (grades K-5) focuses on the rules of learning and is driven largely by memorization. Logic (grades 6-8) helps students develop the disciplines of discernment, reason, and logic in a richly discussion-driven environment. Rhetoric (grades 9-12) synthesizes the rules of learning (grammar) and structure for thinking (logic) so that students can intelligently postulate their own arguments and beliefs.

PROGRAM DISTINCTIONS

JUNIOR & SENIOR THESES: In 11th and 12th grades, Liberty students complete original thesis papers on controversial topics of their own choosing. Each student must argue for one side in their paper (10 pages for Juniors, 20 pages for Seniors), present their arguments before a panel of judges and then defend their positions before those judges.

LATIN: Starting in 3rd grade, students learn Latin, giving them the foundation for language.

PUBLIC SPEAKING: Speech Meet starts in kindergarten and requires each student to memorize and present famous speeches from history.

COLLEGE & CAREER COUNSELING: Starting in 9th grade, students begin the process of self-assessment and personal inventories to prepare them for the future. In 10th grade, they begin our "College Planning" process to help them navigate the decision process for college and career, and the program continues from there.

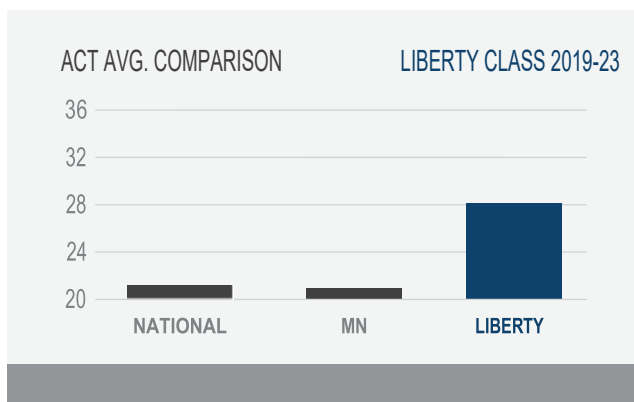

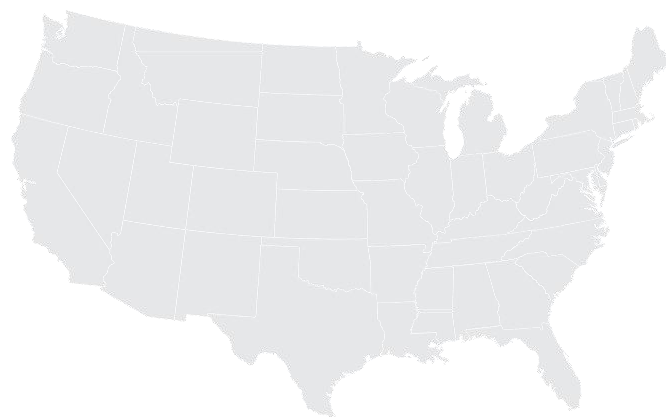
